Footnotes:

1. The English Baccalaureate is not a performance indicator. In effect, it simply tells you how many students opted for GCSE languages.

2. Our Progress 8 figure includes a number of 'outliers'. Outliers are, for example, students who left our school in Year 11 but chose not to continue their education by enrolling in their new local school. Eckington School is deemed 'responsible' for the results (or non-results) of such students. When outliers are removed from our results, our P8 score exceeds that of Derbyshire and looks remarkably like national.

3. After Year 11 (for the 2015 cohort) 94% of our students continued in education, training or employment. This was identical to the national figure. There was little difference to national figures for sub-groups (boys, girls, disadvantaged students). One difference to national data was that 12% of our students took up apprenticeships at 16 as opposed to 6% nationally. Our NEET figure for 2015 was at national, for 2016 we believe that it was below national.
